PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT:

An adjudicatory proceeding will be held pursuant to the provisions of N.Y. Pub. Health Law §230(10)(p) and N.Y. State Admin. Proc. Act §§301-307 and 401. The proceeding will be conducted before a committee on professional conduct of the State Board for Professional Medical Conduct (Committee) on April 23, 2020, at 10:30 a.m., at the offices of the New York State Department of Health, 90 Church Street, New York, NY 10007 and at such other adjourned dates, times and places as the committee may direct.

At the proceeding, evidence will be received concerning the allegations set forth in the Statement of Charges, which is attached. A stenographic record of the proceeding will be made and the witnesses at the proceeding will be sworn and examined.

You may appear in person at the proceeding and may be represented by counsel who shall be an attorney admitted to practice in New York state. You may produce evidence or sworn testimony on your behalf. Such evidence or sworn testimony shall be strictly limited to evidence and testimony relating to the nature and severity of the penalty to be imposed upon the licensee. Where the charges are based on the conviction of state law crimes in other jurisdictions, evidence may be offered which would show that the conviction would not be a crime in New York State. The Committee also may limit the number of witnesses whose testimony will be received, as well as the length of time any witness will be permitted to testify.

If you intend to present sworn testimony, the number of witnesses and an estimate of the time necessary for their direct examination must be submitted to the New York State Department of Health, Division of Legal Affairs, Bureau of Adjudication, Riverview Center, 150

Broadway - Suite 510, Albany, NY 12204-2719, ATTENTION: HON. JAMES HORAN, DIRECTOR, BUREAU OF ADJUDICATION (Telephone: (518-402-0748), (henceforth "Bureau of Adjudication") as well as the Department of Health attorney indicated below, no later than twenty days prior to the scheduled date of the Referral Proceeding, as indicated above.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.Y. Pub. Health Law §230(10)(p), you shall file a written answer to each of the charges and allegations in the Statement of Charges at least ten days prior to the date of the hearing. Any charge or allegation not so answered shall be deemed admitted. You may wish to seek the advice of counsel prior to filing such answer. You may also file a written brief and affidavits with the Committee. All such documents shall be filed with the Bureau of Adjudication, at the address indicated above, and a copy shall be forwarded to the attorney for the Department of Health whose name appears below, at least ten days prior to the date of the hearing. Should the parties have objection(s) to proposed witnesses or documentary evidence, the party raising the objection(s) shall contact the Bureau of Adjudication at least three days prior to the hearing date to arrange for a pre-hearing conference with the Administrative Law Judge, prior to the hearing date.

Not later than ten days prior to the date of the hearing, you are required to file one copy of your proposed exhibits (if any) with the Bureau of Adjudication at the address indicated above, and a copy of all such documents/exhibits must be served on the same date on the Department of Health attorney indicated below. On the day of the hearing, you are also required to provide the original of such exhibits and three copies, for use by the Committee.

Pursuant to §301(5) of the State Administrative Procedure Act, the Department, upon reasonable notice, will provide at no charge a qualified interpreter of the deaf to interpret the proceedings to, and the testimony of, any deaf person. Pursuant to the terms of N.Y. State Admin. Proc. Act §401 and 10 N.Y.C.R.R. §51.8(b), the Petitioner hereby demands disclosure of the evidence that the Respondent intends to introduce at the hearing, including the names of witnesses, a list of and copies of documentary evidence and a description of physical or other evidence which cannot be photocopied.

**YOU ARE HEREBY ADVISED THAT THE ATTACHED CHARGES WILL BE MADE PUBLIC FIVE BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THEY ARE SERVED.**

The proceeding may be held whether or not you appear. Please note that requests for adjournments must be made in writing to the Bureau of Adjudication, at the address indicated above, with a copy of the request to the attorney for the Department of Health, whose name appears below, at least five days prior to the scheduled date of the proceeding. Adjournment requests are not routinely granted. Claims of court engagement will require detailed affidavits of actual engagement. Claims of illness will require medical documentation. Failure to obtain an attorney within a reasonable period of time prior to the proceeding will not be grounds for an adjournment.

The Committee will make a written report of its findings, conclusions as to guilt, and a determination. Such determination may be reviewed by the administrative review board for professional medical conduct.

STATEMENT

OF

CHARGES

SAMUEL CARUTHERS, M.D., was authorized to practice medicine in New York State on or about April 20, 2000, by the issuance of license number 217213 by the New York State Education Department.

**FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

A. On or about June 26, 2019, in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Sussex County, Respondent was sentenced three years' Probation, with a requirement that he serve 24 hours of actual jail time, once a year for three years. Respondent was also required to successfully complete 200 hours of Community Service, enter and successfully complete an Anger Management Program, complete a personality assessment and psychological assessment. Respondent was also barred from having any/all direct, indirect and/or third party contact with the victim and/or the victim's family. The Sentence was based on Jury Trial Verdict on April 3, 2019 in which the Respondent was found guilty of violating the New Jersey Code of Criminal Justice (the "Code") 2C §24-4A(2) (Endangering-Abuse/Neglect of a Child by a Non-Caretaker), 2C § 12-1A(1) (Simple Assault-Purposely/Knowing Cause Bodily Injury), and 2C § 39-5D (Unlawful Possession of Weapon- Other Weapon).

1. The conduct resulting in the Order would constitute misconduct under the laws of New York State, pursuant to the following sections of New York State Law:

a. N.Y. Educ. Law § 6530(9)(a)(iii) Being convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under the law of another jurisdiction and which if committed within the state, would have constituted a crime under New York State law, specifically:

- i) N.Y. Penal Law §260.10 (endangering the welfare of a minor),
- ii) N.Y. Penal Law §265.01 (criminal possession of a weapon) and'
- ii) N.Y. Penal Law §120.00 (assault).

**FIRST SPECIFICATION**

**BEING CONVICTED OF COMMITTING AN ACT CONSTITUING A CRIME**

Respondent is charged with committing professional misconduct as defined in N.Y. Educ. Law § 6530(9)(a)(iii) Being convicted of committing an act constituting a crime under the law of another jurisdiction and which if committed within the state, would have constituted a crime under New York State law, namely N.Y. Penal Law §§260.10, 265.01 and 120.00, as alleged in the facts of the following:
